
Here are some links to hubs for art and visual history specific OER. While mostly United States and Europe focused, they can provide a springboard for content creation and learning.

Three Methods of Using AER/OER:


- 1) Assigned Course Readings Traditional Disciplinary Skills
 - Affordable Educational Resources Archer Library/Leganto system
 - Open Educational Resources Web-based scholarly sources
- 2) "Asynchronous" Course Content Fun and Educational Content to Teach Critical Skills and Present Alternative Voices (and giving students a break from listening to me!)
 - Videos (see the art object in situ)
 - Web essays and articles (exhibition reviews etc.)
 - Grey literature (archival and institutional documents)
- 3) Images in Lectures Discipline Specific Practice in the Web 2.0 World
 - Sourcing accurate and ethical images for my presentations
 - Modelling proper academic practices for students






